Laurie walked under the ladder but Tommy and Emily didn't. Nothing happened, and they were happy.

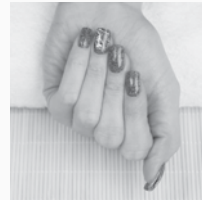
When they arrived at school, Laurie went to her classroom and the two other went to theirs. The first part of the morning was OK.
